MARQUES explained that EMMI is reviewing the Euribor Governance STEERING COMMITTEE Framework in preparation of the filing for authorisation and the transition to the new Euribor methodology. Therefore, the composition, duties and functioning of the Steering Committee will be established in separate Terms of Reference which will be annexed to the Code of Conduct. She presented the articles that contain substantial changes or introduce new provisions regarding duties of members, composition of the SC, suitability, appointment & revocation rules, confidentiality, decisions & votes, conflicts of interest, etc. SC members made some comments and asked for clarifications on some points. **Decision and votes:** n/a **Action points:** Ms G. MARQUES will incorporate the required changes and will send the revised draft to SC members for approval during the next meeting in November. ITEM 5 **Discussion Points: EURIBOR PROJECT** Steering Committee members received confidentiality guidelines in the context of the review of the Euribor methodology. They also received an update on the progress of the Testing Phase, which ended on 31st July 2018. EMMI confirmed that a new stakeholder consultation will be published in October 2018 and a feedback summary in January 2019. Mr A. ## ITEM 6 **Discussion Points: EURIBOR OVERSIGHT** a) Benchmark Operations Overview: Steering Committee members received a report on the quality of the calculation and publication process during the months of June through August 2018. Mr. A. LOPEZ informed the members that the index had been published on time every day throughout the period. In addition, there had been no indications of 'no participation' from a Panel Bank. Over the whole period there were 19 cases of multiple contributions and 3 instances in which the calculation agent had to contribute on behalf of a bank. b) Back-Testing Highlights: Mr. A. LÓPEZ also presented the Euribor benchmark Data Integrity and Back-testing report covering the months of May through August 2018. Following the Steering Committee members' request during the last meeting to investigate further on a bank's rationale for a submission in May 2018, EMMI reported its discoveries and insight on the submission. Steering Committee members considered the explanation satisfactory and the issue solved. **Decision and votes:** n/a **Action points:** n/a. ITEM 7 **Discussion points: EONIA OVERSIGHT** Mr. V. TSONCHEV (ECB) presented the EONIA Contribution Process Quality Report for June, July and August 2018. In June, EONIA was always published on time and calculated according to the input received. In total, there were three cases of multiple contributions and one nonreachable bank. In July, there were no particular issues, except for one multiple contributions. In August, EONIA was always published on time and calculated according to the input received. There was one case in which the ECB had to contribute on behalf of a bank. **Decision and votes:** n/a
